

## **MODULAR-MOTORED TRUCKS?**

What you're looking at here is Ford's new 4.6-liter V8, the motivating force behind the 1993 Lincoln Mark VIII. This modular engine features an aluminum block and heads, a double overhead cam, four-valve-per-chamber valvetrain, and all sorts of other high-tech niceties to produce a respectable 290 horsepower. That's more power (with supposedly better mileage) than the current 5.0L 302. What does this luxo-barge engine have to do with trucks? Ford has revealed that the 4.6 is destined to power truck platforms, but Ford tells us that substantial changes have to be made to the crossmember, frame, and engine compartment sheetmetal in order to make it fit. But can you just imagine a hightech, 290-horse Ranger? We sure can. When we ask Ford's Special Vehicle Team (SVT) if they have any plans for the Ranger, they just reply with big smiles.

new head unit is voice activated. A small, noise-canceling microphone clips onto your visor or dash and allows your voice to control not only the AM/FM/cassette stereo, but also a trunk-mounted CD changer, and a built-in cellular phone. The phone plays through the stereo speakers or, if you have someone in the car and want your conversation private, through an infrared handset. The name hung on the new system is Las Vegas, so we assume that it will also scan the dial for any 24-hour, all-Wayne Newton stations. Or maybe Elvis.
