he latest weapon in the speed limit The latest weapon in the operation which wars is the laser speed gun, which can't be detected with existing radar detectors. Manufacturers of the laser guns claim that it can't be detected at all, but Cincinnati Microwave has announced that it has indeed developed a working prototype, and could go into production if there's enough demand. The laser guns cost three times as much as a conventional radar gun, however, so there are only about 200 laser guns in use out of an estimated 200,000 speed measurement devices nationwide, meaning that demand isn't high enough to produce the laser detectors-yet.
